- Sharing some experiences to generate ideas about how to work more effectively with small holder farmers in the future

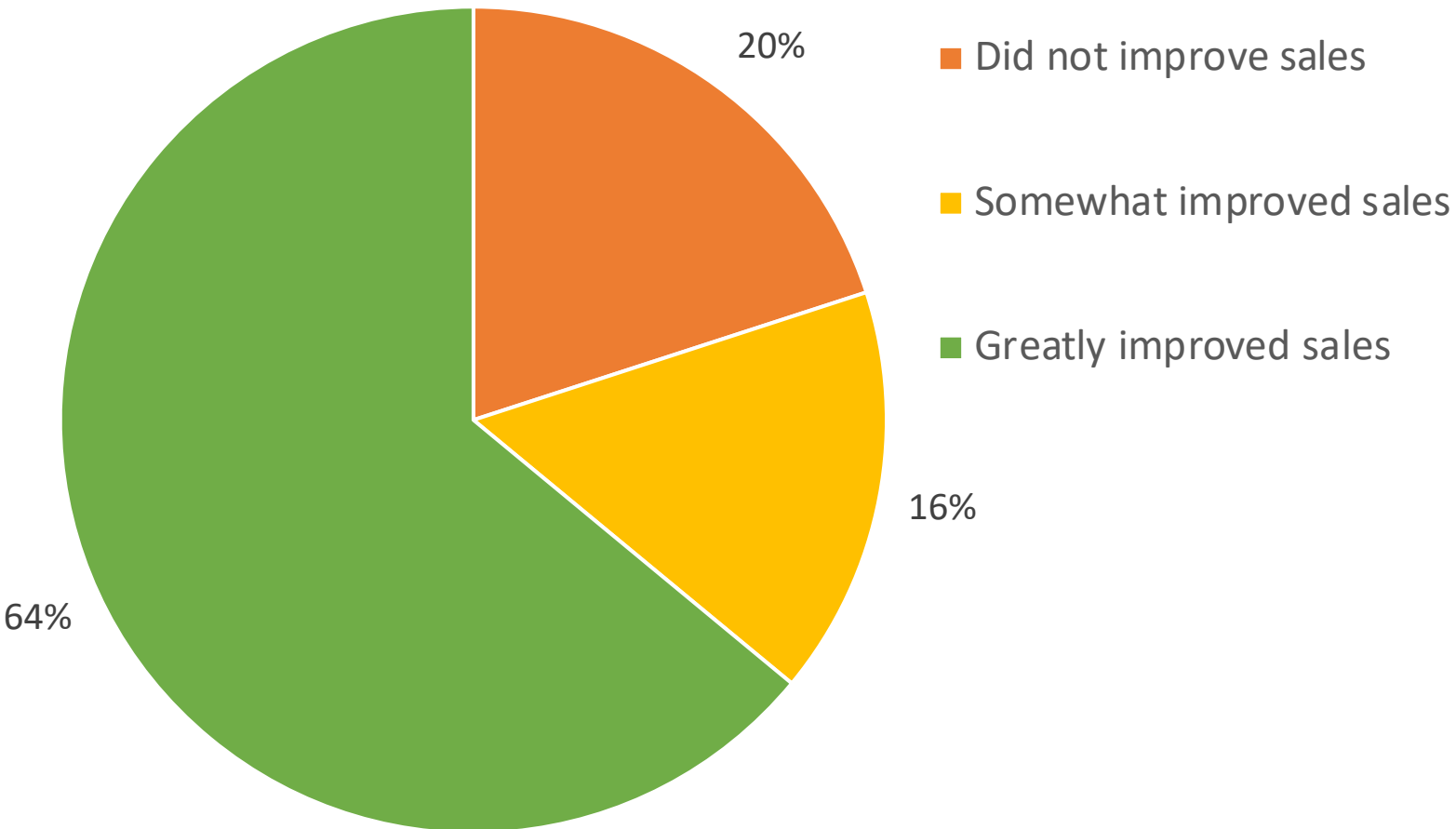
1- Provide weighing scales to farmers

- Weigh scales can help farmers to estimate their animal's sale value based on their weight
- Awareness to the farmers about market strategy
- To be better informed while negotiating with traders / buyers
- *Better access to information about prices/other market information (e.g. current prices in mandis)*



Small amount of extra data collected from the farmers during routine team visits, in the form of pre/post Eid survey on CommCare. Asked farmers:

Do you think that weighing goats/sheep improved your success selling them this Eid?



2-Training on tick management

Provided one day camp for treating tick infestation, because:

- We noticed that ticks were an important problem
- Farmers didn't have much information about how to manage and really wanted more information
- Intervention and coordination with Livestock department for future collaboration
- Transfer this practices/techniques to other farmers

Feedback:

- “We have learnt knowledge about it that how we clean our pen area and do deworming of tick every 3 months”
- “From this knowledge we will protect our animals”
- “These types of training should happen in each month so uneducated persons can find out how to rear our animals in the best way”
- “We want to do these types of trainings in future”



3-FMD Outbreak

- To raise awareness of disease occurrence and impact in villages
- To access to health services/treatments to help in preparation
- Provide case material and data to support efforts to improve disease management to key stakeholders like DG, VOs, unis, etc

Feedback:

- “Initially I didn't knew about how to control and prevent the disease but your project has guided us in better way. I will take care of it in future.”
